Guest Speaker Jacqueline Bussie

Jacqueline Bussie, Ph.D., is an award-winning author, professor, theologian, and student of life in all its messy beauty, as well as a sought-after speaker and workshop facilitator. Her first book, "The Laughter of the Oppressed," won the national Trinity Prize. Her second book, "Outlaw Christian: Finding Authentic Faith by Breaking the Rules," won the gold medal for Christian Living in the Illumination Book Awards. Her latest book, "Love Without Limits: Jesus' Radical Vision for a Love with No Exceptions," won bronze among Christian Living books in a contest by the website Readers' Favorite and was named religion book of the year (third place overall for nonfiction) by the Independent Author Network. Publishers Weekly called it "a must-read for all Christians interested in inclusivity for their communities."

An active servant leader in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Prof. Bussie spent the last 20 years teaching religion to undergraduates at ELCA colleges and serving as the founding director of the Forum on Faith and Life at Concordia College. Today, she is the executive director of the Collegeville (Minnesota) Institute in Collegeville, Minnesota. Every day, she is amazed and grateful that she gets to write and tell her story, empower others to write and tell theirs, and accompany marvelous people on their journeys of faith, hope, and healing.
